End Regular Season Undefeated Untied

CAIRO.—Thomasville's Bulldogs picked up a full pot of gold at a football rainbow's end as they trounced the Cairo Syrupmakers, 27-6, here last night to capture the Region 1-A championship and become Thomasville's first undefeated, untied team since the school started playing football in 1914.

An overflow crowd of 4,000 jammed the way into Cairo's Bryon Bowl stadium to see the Bulldogs' second game and air attack with a stout Cairo defense in the second half. The Bulldogs' offense, in conjunction with a slim six point lead, but they moved for three touchdowns in the second half. Syrupmakers got their offense rolling and score just before the game closed.

Thomasville's 10th straight victory of the season also earned for the Bulldogs the right to keep the Syrup Pitcher Trophy, symbol of victory in the annual game between the two teams. The Bulldogs, who believed the (Thomasville) Journal of 1928 and 1929 when the trophies were each held twice, now moves into the playoffs for the Region 1-A title. The Bulldogs will play a game at the state U. S. They will meet the winner of the other team's game between Valdosta and Newnan in their first playoff game.

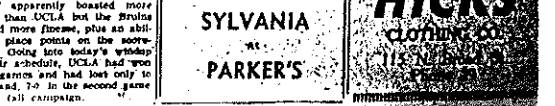

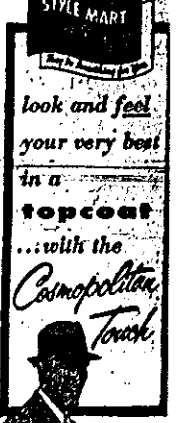
