As a result, Coach Hay Skin-ner has made a switch that may be unique in college basketball history

"He certainly isn't the muscle-type center," said Skin-ner, dean of SEC coaches, "but otherwise he does a real line job."

Van Breda Kulff, the son of the Memphis Tams' coach, is a slender 185-pounder
