Dawgs hope to get defensive

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) — Georgia led its Champ and still has the makings of a championship defense.
The No. 12 Bulldogs seem to have cornered the market on speed, quickness and athleticism — even though cornerback Champ Bailey gave up his final year of eligibility to play in the NFL.
Pilly Adrian Hollingshead, the third-leading tackler a year ago but relegated to the third string for Saturday's opener against Utah State.
"Every defense has to leave its own mark. We hope to leave our mark this year."

The linebacking corps figures to leave its mark — especially on opposing players. Orantes Grant had 120 tackles last season, while sophomore Doug Bailey — Champ's brother — and Will Witherspoon are probably just stopping by Sanford Stadium on their way to the NFL.
Bailey and Witherspoon are so good the Bulldogs decided to move Hollingshead and another starting linebacker, Dustin Luckie, to defensive end.
Hollingshead asked to be moved back to linebacker after spring practice, but he's now playing behind Witherspoon and junior-college transfer Kendrick Bell.
"The defensive youth movement is well represented on the two-deep depth chart, which

lists 10 freshmen and sophomores. The Bulldogs also have a new defensive coordinator, Kevin Ramsey, lured away from rival Tennessee.
Changes were in order after the Bulldogs allowed more than 352 yards per game — seventh in the Southeastern Conference — and also ranked in the bottom half of the 12-team league in rushing and passing defense.
"There's nothing magical about what we're doing now," coach Jim Donnan said. "We've just got better guys running it."
Georgia, coming off a 9-3 season that included a Peach Bowl victory, is a four-time national favorite against Utah, which won only three games. The Dawgs have won their last two home openers by a combined score of 94-10 and feature one of

the nation's top quarterbacks, sophomore Quincy Carter.
"Watching Georgia on film, I saw Quincy Carter scramble out and throw a strike 62 yards on a straight line," Utah State coach Dave Arnesen said. "I've never seen anything like that before. I hope I never see it again. We'll try to keep him on the ground."
Carter, the SEC's freshman of the year after throwing for 2,454 yards and 12 touchdowns, already is being touted for the Heisman Trophy on a university Web site.
"The Web site is great," he said. "But it's not going to win football games."
Carter will be throwing to an entirely new group of receivers. In addition Bailey, who played both ways and caught 47 passes, the Bulldogs lost Tony Small (48

didn't. Thomasville even made a big play on special teams when Ivey blocked an Early County punt to set up a Bulldog field goal, which made the score 10-0 with a little over a minute left to play in the third quarter.
It was, of course, one of just many big plays for the talented senior.
He led a game-clinching touchdown drive early in the fourth quarter to put the game on ice.
He hit tailback Quinton Davis with a 40-yard pass before he ran the Bulldogs into the end zone with a 22-yard keeper and a 1-yard quarterback sneak.
"No. 5 is a player," Johnson said of his senior quarterback.

"It makes me look like I know what I'm doing."
For the night, Ivey ran nine times for 43 yards and the score and completed six of nine passes for 83 more yards.
Other key contributors on offense were Davis with 17 carries for 96 yards and three catches for 24 yards. And freshman Kenry Burkson, who came in late in the fourth quarter and tucked up 47 yards on only five carries.
In total, the Bulldogs got an even 200 yards rushing on 43 carries. THS now has a week off before they play Leon in Tallahassee, Fla.

Braves smash Diamondbacks, 7-3

ATLANTA (AP) — Andres Galarraga was feeling a bit of pressure Friday night. Cured of cancer and back in the Braves dugout for the first time this season, he didn't want to distract the hottest team in baseball.
Not to worry Big Cat. Kevin Millwood allowed only one hit through seven innings and had a two-run single,

Andrew Jones homered and made another spectacular catch, and streaking Atlanta welcomed back Galarraga with a 7-3 victory over the Arizona Diamondbacks. The Braves won for the 13th time in 14 games in a matchup of division leaders.
"I'm glad we won," said Galarraga, who plans to spend the rest of the season with the team though he won't attempt a

comeback until 2000. "Everything has been going so well. I wanted them to continue winning while I was sitting on the bench."
With Millwood (15-7) on the mound, the chances were good. The right hander has been on a sensational streak, allowing just 15 hits in his last five starts. That span, covering 41 innings, included a 10-inning, two-hit

performance in his previous start at St. Louis in which he didn't receive a decision.
"I don't know what it is," Millwood said. "I'm making some good pitches, the guys are playing really good defense behind me."
No one has played better defense than Jones, who robbed Jay Bell of his 33rd homer with another Glove Catch.
